

Thursday, February 10, 1938

Geraldine Dooley seconded the motion. The motion was carried.

Betty Stuckey gave a report on the letter contest we have been thinking about. She asked our reaction to our giving three prizes of five dollars, two dollars, and one dollar respectively for first second and third prizes. Letters are to be handed in to the post office window and placed the box we have there. Our next Council meeting will be February 24, in the meantime we are to keep in mind the following:
