- I. President Horstein's report:
 - i. Dress Code

 - ii. President Horstein has received many complaints from students that the dress code is not finished.
 - iii. He will move forward after the meeting.
- ii. SGA in ISU's Constitution:
 - i. He says that Betty Kinzer expressed her support for this issue.
 - ii. He is announcing that he is establishing a committee to investigate the proper channels, benchmarking, etc.
 - iii. This will be to become the governing body of ISU's student body.
- iii. Planning for the Future:
 - i. He does not want people to hold meetings that plan for the future in the office.
 - ii. The office is not the place to discuss this.
 - iii. Everyone should make sure they are fulfilling their duties first and foremost.

- v. Constitution Exam:

 - i. It is critical to him and University to have student representation on this task force as Illinois State is a part of a grant for the Bloomington-Normal Campus-Community Coalition with Illinois Wesleyan, Heartland, Lincoln, and Chestnut Healthcare.
 - ii. The purpose of this task force is to create a strategic plan to address alcohol abuse. Please let me know by Friday, October 5th, if you are interested in serving on this task force.
- ii. Alaina Filkin from the Vice President of Student Affairs office has requested two students' representatives from Student Government Association to serve on the team Excellence Award Committee.
 - i. The Team Excellence Award was established in 1997 to recognize collaborative efforts of a group demonstrating exemplary teamwork.
 - ii. The Illinois State University Team Excellence Awards will be presented annually on Founder's Day.
 - iii. Please let him know by Friday, October 5th, if you are interested in serving on this task force.
- iii. Senator Miller and Senator Campbell are the only two Senators who have expressed interest in serving on the Student Elections Committee.
 - i. The current election code requires two representatives from Student Government to serve on the Committee.
 - ii. It is important that we have representation on this Committee.
 - iii. If you are willing to serve on this committee, please let him know by Friday, October 5th.
- iv. He and President Horstein have been working on updating the Student Government website but have been unsuccessfully in reaching our target date of October 1st to go live.
 - i. The Institutional Web Support Services has numerous projects going on and has not been able to give all of their attention to just our project.
 - ii. They are working on getting this project completed and we look forward to working with the new Technology Director to assist.
 - iii. He would like to say the new website would be live no later November 1, 2007.

- iv. He appreciates those of you who took the time to fill out those individual website information sheets.
- v. If anyone has questions or would like to see the website to provide feedback, please do not hesitate to ask him.
- v. The American Student Government Association Conference in Washington DC this past weekend was enjoyable and they were able to gather many connections and information.

- i. Many students have a great deal of concerns out there, and everyone should find something they care about and want to see change to work on.
- ii. Everyone has their committees, other Senators, and Assembly Officers to use as resource for helping, and the Executive Officers are always here to help you as resource.
- iii. He would like to inform everyone that he will be starting many of his own initiatives and projects that he hopes to accomplish this year.

III. Chief of Staff Neville's report:

- i. Budget Report:
 - i. SGA's allocation each year is \$48,248.
 - ii. Our balance is currently \$35,213.61.
 - iii. Our anticipated rollover is \$42,480.37.
 - i. This would put our balance at \$77,693.98.
 - iv. She is still finalizing expenses and waiting for certain items to go through bill processing and datatel, but she does have the final numbers on Festival ISU and the Fall Retreat.
 - v. For Festival ISU, we allocated \$500, and spent only \$55.92 on handbills.
 - vi. For the Fall Retreat, we allocated \$2,250, but spent \$2,013.
 - i. This left us \$237 under budget.
 - vii. She has been interviewing potential Public Relations Directors and Technology Directors.
 - viii. She reminds everyone that payroll is due this week.
 - i. She will not be accepting timecards for hours worked in the office.
 - ii. Everyone must swipe if they are in the office and working, otherwise they will not get paid.
 - iii. The paycheck for this pay period should arrive on Friday.

IV. Speaker Cassata's report:

- i. Coordinators should see him to receive their calendars.
- ii. There will be a master calendar in the office for everyone to know what is going on.
- iii. He found a time for an Assembly Executive Meeting on Fridays at 3pm.

V. Deputy Speaker's Graham's report:

- i. She can not answer constituent emails for everyone.
 - i. She can only direct you to someone who may know how to answer them.
 - i. Please do not ask her to take care of feedback emails.

- ii. The only ones she will be handling are those asking to be taken off of the listserv.
- iii. Some people have not sent their emails yet. These people are: Senators Anders, Cail, Perr, and Thorgesen.
- ii. She called Erin Pearce and she sent an alphabetical list of all the RSOs to Graham
 - i. She will send the Underrepresented Senators a list of all the information they will need by the end of the week.
- iii. She is working on various constituent contact events.
 - i. Everyone will receive more information at the next Assembly Meeting.
- iv. She will be mailing everyone a constituent contact report by Friday.
- v. Senator Anders says that he sent his email out Monday.
 - i. Advisor Zompetti says Anders did send his out.

- iv. He will personally be in charge of the Daily Vidette, and he will be meeting with the Business Manager from this department at 11:30 on Friday.
- v. He is working on updating the co-sponsorship and agreement forms, and he will have these ready for approval no later than Monday, October 8th.

IX. Program Director McKenna's report:

 - i. She reminds everyone that they are required to sign up for one event for one hour, and that they should wear their polos or pullovers at the event.
 - ii. Vice President Martin says that this is the first year in five that the Association is not participating in the teams competition.
- iii. Senator Jackie Krug says that UPB has already closed the teams competition.
- iii. Float
 - i. She is passing around sign-up sheets for float building, and reminds everyone that they are required to build the float for at least 3 hours.
 - ii. She also wants to know if anyone would be interested in beginning to build the float this Sunday, October 7th.
 - i. People can sign up for Sunday, and she will see how many people are interested.
- iii. Senator Miller asks if there is anything that can be done for the float during office hours.
 - i. Programs Director McKenna says that people will have to travel out to the garage to fulfill their hours.
 - ii. Chief of Staff Neville says people do not need to be in the office for their office hours, but they can work on float building instead.

- iv. Vice President Martin asks if it is possible to type up the lists and email them out to everyone.
 - i. Programs Director McKenna says she will do that.
 - iv. She passes around a sign-up sheet for anyone that wants to participate in the Ringing of the Bell at the Homecoming Game.
 - v. She reminds people that they need to be at the parade on October 13th at 9:30am.
 - i. There will be more details coming.
- X. Advisor Zompetti's report:
 - i. Everyone has officially been in office for 69 official school days, excluding weekends.
 - i. We only have 92 more days to go.
 - ii. We are almost at the halfway point of our term.
 - ii. If people are not where they expected to be with a specific issue, she suggests people get started.
 - iii. She reminds everyone that this is the final opportunity to change hours for the remainder of the semester.
 - iv. She reminds people that Devil's Advocate Sessions can be scheduled at any time whether at the idea phase, proposal phase, and the presentation phase.
 - i. She wants people to schedule a Devil's Advocate Session prior to submitting that legislation Executive Committee for consideration of placement on the agenda.
 - v. Devil's Advocate Sessions are a place to ensure that the best possible options for resolving issues or creating new programs come to the floor of the Assembly.
 - i. Devil's Advocate Sessions will work out the kinks in a proposal, cutting debate time on the floor, and providing for a better outcome.
 - ii. To schedule a session, a person only needs to announce that they would like one during Passing of the Gavel, and the appropriate party will get it scheduled.
 - vi. ASGA National Summit Attendees
 - i. She thanks External Relations Director Cullen for getting meetings scheduled with 3 of the 4 legislators or their staff in Washington, D.C.
 - ii. She would like to recognize those attendees for doing a phenomenal job in sessions.
 - i. ISU's SGA was the talk of the conference in many distinct and positive ways.
 - ii. This was the first year in the last three that our SGA has stood out in such a remarkable way.
 - iii. She gives special props to President Horstein for presenting one session and co-presenting another, as well as leading roundtable discussions.

- iv. She also gives props to Vice President Martin for co-presenting a session.
 - iii. She looks forward to each person who attended to bring back elements of what they learned and sharing them with the Association in the near future.
