 - a. Rubashkin: not enough details, should have details first before putting it up for vote; too general
 - b. Olendzki: not in support; there are enough smokers bans restricting smokers as it is
 - c. McMahon: will definitely be voting yes; students need a chance to voice opinions
 - d. Boldt: was a bit skeptical at first, but have come to realize that this is an important task to give students; they need the right to vote on such matters
 - e. Olshak provides some historical context at this point
 - i. Referendums have typically been used as a means to get conversations started about specific tentative issues. They were not meant to produce a product. Zach wants a sampling of student opinion to start such a conversation. The recreation center was once nothing but a conversation. Conversations can lead to actions; actions to product.
 - ii. Owens accepts
 - f. Tomlin is in favor; this is a conversation worth having
 - g. ARH: good risk to take
 - h. Secretary Diaz call the question; there are no objections
